The Village is working to address the issue of teenage drinking and parties throughout the Village. The Village continues to negotiate with its four unions. The recent installation of cameras along Rockaway Avenue near GCHS has seemed to reduce speeding near the school.

Resident Comments

Residents at the meeting expressed their support for a Child at Play sign along Euston and Main which was requested by various residents on those streets. A resident inquired into the Village cutting the lawn of a home on Sackville between Stewart and Stratford. Apparently the homeowner has neglected the property and the Village cut the lawn and is looking into how best to handle the situation going forward. A resident mentioned that some children were throwing

bottles at a construction vehicle parked on Stratford and Weyord. Finally, a resident asked whether the Village Code permitted the parking of an RV in a private resident's driveway.
