3	little premature, but we'll deal with
4	the weather, whatever comes tomorrow.
5	And the Village garage will be open
6	on a daily basis to be used. It will
7	start getting cleaned up by this
8	week, and by next week we'll have the

10	lot. The rest of the beach will be
11	closed until May to pull back the
12	debris and the water line.
13	We're waiting for the
14	contractor. Everything is set to go
15	to address our main we have four
16	main broken storm drains that are
17	collapsing, and we're just waiting
18	for the weather to break to get in
19	there fast, too.
20	The street lights have been
21	repaired, but if you know of any,
22	please report it to the Village Hall
23	so we don't have to wait until the
24	next meeting.
25	We have started sweeping the

2	streets of the sand and debris from
3	the winter, and just started
4	addressing the potholes, mostly a
5	cold patch; and when the hot plants
6	open up, you'll see more hot patch on
7	a steady basis.
8	The street signs are continuing
9	now. You'll see the street signs
10	going up all over the Village, new
11	street signs. There's a few places
12	that he has to get back to that's
13	all the those cutouts you see. Some
14	of them are in really bad shape and
15	we're on their case, so they're going
16	to do it.
17	That's my report, Mayor.

15	restricted parking, 27; blocking a
16	driveway, there was 4; blocking a
17	sidewalk, there was 2; alternate
18	street parking, there was 47 tickets
19	given out; parking in a bus stop,
20	there was 3; left on curb, there was
21	1; no handicap permit, there was 1;
22	more than 12 inches from the curb,
23	that was 2; parked in travel portion
24	of the road, there was 2; expired
25	inspection, there was 43; expired

3	plate, there was 3; for a total of
4	415 tickets given out by the Code

6	The Fire Department didn't come
7	in yet with the paperwork, so I don't
8	have that tonight.
9	MAYOR McGINTY: Thank you,
10	Deputy Mayor Trustee.
11	The Village Hall continues with
12	extended hours: Tuesday, 9:00 a.m.
13	to 6:00 p.m.; two Saturdays per
14	month, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The
15	Village Hall was last open on
16	Saturday March 7; it will be open
17	again on March 21.
18	We continue with Saturday
19	morning Meet the Mayor. The last
20	session was February 28. The next
21	session is this Saturday, from 9:00
22	to 12:00.
23	In addition, before I introduce
24	our Chief of Department, I want to
25	just tell you how proud I am of our

2	staff. Right now, they're pursuing
3	several major grants, one with the
4	Federal Department of Commerce. Two
5	grants, for lack of a better phrase,
6	tree grants with New York State and
7	the Arbor Foundation. They're
8	pursuing a third, and a new zoning
9	grant. And as we continue our
10	attempts to reduce costs, our staff
11	has had to work hard, so I applaud
12	them.
13	The second point I want to
14	make Chief, just bear with me one
15	more moment. The second point I want
16	to make is that, in the last year,
17	due to the hard work of your Village
18	Board, which operates the Board of
19	Directors, a Corporate Board of
20	Directors, our debt has been
21	restructured, and we're saving money
22	daily on this restructuring. And
23	this Board deserves a hand from you
24	for their hard work. I can't tell
25	you how proud I am to serve with

3	But, speaking of pride, Chief
4	of Department D'Esposito, my favorite
5	possession you know what it is;
6	don't you? My favorite possession is
7	my Fire Department jacket. It's my
8	favorite. I can't tell you how proud
9	I am that you guys have taken my wife
10	and I into your family. We're
11	honored, we're incredibly proud.
12	Maybe someday you'll know what all
13	of you, maybe someday you'll all know
14	what that means to my wife and I. I
15	want to thank you.
16	Chief, we're here good
17	evening, Mr. Cornachio. How are you?
18	(Whereupon, Mr. Cornachio
19	entered the room.)
20	MAYOR McGINTY: Chief, would
21	you discuss our pumper?
22	CHIEF D'ESPOSITO: Before I get
23	into that, I wanted to introduce some
24	people tonight. For those of you
25	that don't know, right after

2	Hurricane Sandy, on November 2, we
3	lost a pumper. And Chief Ricky
4	Spencer, the Chief of the Fire
5	Department of the city of Roswell in
6	Georgia, facilitated, had their
7	pumper sent down here to Island Park
8	and it served us for the last
9	two years. So him and his wife,
10	Joanna, have come down for our wet
11	down this Sunday.
12	MAYOR McGINTY: Sir, I speak
13	for everybody. We're so happy you're
14	with us. We're in awe of your
15	service. Thank you.
16	CHIEF SPENCER: The Fire
17	Service is a brotherhood, whether
18	it's in the same Fire Department or
19	it's in the same county, city, state,
20	or country. And when one of our
21	brothers needs help, we do our best
22	to help them any way we can. And as
23	a representative of the city of
24	Roswell, retired, I bring thanks to
25	you for the generosity you showed to

3	what we did for you. I would have
4	had it no other way. It was one of
5	the proudest moments of my 39-year
6	career to be able to do that for you
7	for you guys.
8	MAYOR McGINTY: Chief Tice, the

10	CHIEF TICE: It's been a long
11	time coming to this. First of all, I
12	would like to thank the Mayor, the
13	Village Board, and everybody who was
14	instrumental in getting this piece of
15	apparatus. This piece of apparatus
16	that we labored on for years, this is
17	a state of the art pumper. To say
18	that I hope and pray that it stays a
19	great truck for its entirety is a
20	wish. Unfortunately, it's not what
21	it was purchased for. I hope the day
22	never comes that we have to use it to
23	its full potential, but it's got
24	potential beyond most people's ideas.
25	This was a truck that was
