- 20 lights and meters that were reported not working
- 21 are being repaired. All the Village owned
- 22 property is being maintained.
- 23 As far as the trees, the arborist
- 24 reports and pictures were sent to FEMA. We are
- 25 waiting to hear back from them. Over five

- 3 drains, each one is being vacuumed out, high
- 4 pressure hoses being sent in there. All the
- 5 debris and sediment coming out, we sent a camera
- 6 in there. We found all kinds of strange things
- 7 in there. They're loaded with concrete, metal,
- 8 plastic bottles, all kinds of surprises.
- 9 Parking meters to be monitored,
- 10 repaired as needed. Street sweeping being done
- 11 on an as-needed basis. Landscaping of the
- 12 Village's properties being maintained on a
- 13 weekly schedule. Masone Beach, we started
- 14 cleaning up. All the snow fencing is down
- 15 except for the water line. Flags, banners and
- 16 flower pots will be going up this week.
- 17 Municipal parking lots being
- 18 landscaped and swept. Some potholes are being
- 19 filled. Potholes, we are doing them around the
- 20 village. There will be more going on. Stop
- 21 lines at crosswalks will be painted right after
- 22 we get through the holidays and summer comes.
- 23 Street signs, parking signs and traffic signs
- 24 are being replaced as soon as the shipment comes
- 25 in.

- 2 Stassi Brothers is scheduled to repair

- 4 Suffolk. DPW garage area, we built a stormwater
- 5 filteration system. It's all by district

- 8 progress. It's going to be straightened up,
- 9 cleaned up and all the junk will be discarded.

- 14 Park Fire Department, the second floor. We are
- 15 working on that through the Governor's Office of
- 16 Storm Recovery.
- 17 The bids for village hall have gone
- 18 out. We received interest from five different
- 19 contractors and we have gotten calls from two
- 20 others. So we are up to eight. So we ought to
- 21 get a good mix and we ought to get decent
- 22 pricing.
- Our Deputy Mayor has been putting in a
- 24 great number of hours with this drainage
- 25 project. We have expanded the scope of the
