5	MAYOR McGINTY: We are happy to
б	report that in accord with the Hazard
7	Mitigation Grant Program, a thorough
8	cleaning and inspection of all the drains
9	in the Village has been completed.
10	The FEMA supervised and funded
11	tree removal project is still underway
12	and continues to move forward. The
13	Board has authorized me to sign a
14	contract for removal of the remaining
15	tree stumps.
16	The Emergency Management
17	Center, which is the renovation of the
18	2-floor of the fire house project, is
19	underway. H2M has been contracted with
20	to provide the architectural and
21	engineering services for this project.
22	Funding for resiliency and hardening of
23	the second floor of the fire house has
24	been awarded through the Governor's
25	Office of Storm Recovery.

2	Funding is being pursued for
3	the zombie house issues here in the
4	Village. This includes interface with
5	mortgage holders and property owners.
6	We will be replacing the
7	diesel and gasoline fuel tanks at the
8	Department of Public Works garage. The
9	present tanks have reached a replacement
10	stage and the new tanks have been
11	pressure tested and indicate no leakage.
12	In response to our request to
13	Nassau County, two new stop signs have
14	been installed at the intersection of
15	Warwick and Quebec Roads in both the
16	eastbound and westbound lanes. The
17	aforementioned intersections had
18	becoming increasingly dangerous over
19	time and have been the site of numerous
20	accidents. The safety and wellbeing of
21	our residents is paramount and we are
22	ecstatic that the County validated our
23	concerns by complying with the request.
24	As I am sure you know Village
25	Hall operates with extended business

4	Village Hall is open Tuesdays from 8:00
5	a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and select Saturday

9	Saturday morning hours will be posted in
10	the near future.
11,	Meet the Mayor Sessions are
