4 MAYOR MCGINTY: Madam Clerk, would you
5 read the roll?

6 MS. CONROY: Trustee Volpe-Ried.

7 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Here.

8 MS. CONROY: Trustee Matthew Paccione.

9 TRUSTEE PACCIONE: Present.

10 MS. CONROY: Trustee Irene Naudus.

11 MAYOR MCGINTY: Excused. She is
12 taking care of Village business with the Fire
13 Department.

14 MS. CONROY: Deputy Mayor Joseph
15 Annarella.

16 TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Here.

17 MS. CONROY: And Village Attorney
18 Anthony Cornacho.

19 MR. CORNACHO: Here.

20 MAYOR MCGINTY: Trustee Volpe-Ried,
21 would you start off with the Beach and
22 Recreation report, please?

23 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Masone Beach
24 remains open to the public on weekdays and
25 weekends from nine a.m. to sunset, weather

2 permitting. Our 90th anniversary Masone Beach
3 tags are available during the week of Monday
4 through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The summer
5 concert schedule is July 23rd, Simply Diamond, a
6 Neil Diamond tribute band. August 13th is Who
7 Love You, a tribute band to Frankie Vallie and
8 the 4 Seasons and the Boys from New Jersey.
9 September 3rd is Captain Jack, a Billy Joel
10 tribute band and also a fireworks display,
11 anniversary display. Summer concerts are
12 Saturday starting at seven-thirty.

13 The gazebo rentals are available at
14 Village Hall. Dates are filling up quickly, so
15 please come in as soon as possible to reserve a
16 date this summer. The snack shack is selling
17 food and drinks and apparel. We are happy to
18 announce that the Mackoul Group will be
19 sponsoring the Masone Beach Movie Night this
20 summer. We have this Friday is Zootopia, July
21 31st, West Side Story, August 6th, Inside Out,
22 August 10th, My Big Fat Greek Wedding, August
23 19th, Minions, August 20th, Jaws. All movies

5 TRUSTEE PACCIONE: One building fire,
6 seven automatic building alarms, forty-six
7 rescues, three auto accidents, one brush fire,
8 one report wires down, one mutual aid, one with
9 engine mutual aid requiring ladder and five
10 mutual aid rescues for a total of seventy-three.
11 Five arrests, six accidents, nine moving
12 tickets, four parked tickets, Twenty-nine aided
13 cases. Robbery and burglary reports, nothing to
14 report. Respectfully submitted.

15 MAYOR MCGINTY: Deputy Mayor Trustee
16 Annarella, the Public Works report.

17 TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: The following was
18 collected in June: Ninety-seven tons municipal
19 solid waste, four point four three tone of
20 agricultural waste and fourteen point three tons
21 of mixed glass. All street lights and meters
22 reported not working have been repaired. All
23 Village owned property is being maintained. The
24 DPW is working with the contractor Pipeline to
25 continue to clean catch basins and flush out the

2 drains. Walden is doing the video monitoring
3 and GPS mapping of all the drains in the
4 Village.

5 We are still operating the water
6 separation system at the Village garage area
7 under the DEC guidelines. Parking lots stall
8 lines have been painted on an ongoing basis and
9 then we will go to the streets and do the stop
10 lines. We put down four tons of blacktop last
11 month. The trees, FEMA said they will pay for
12 removal of three hundred eighty-eight trees of
13 over five hundred inspected. They will pay for
14 a project manager to oversee the project at no
15 cost to the Village taxpayers. The Village will
16 be meeting with HMBG the first week of August.
17 The question is do we plant trees now or wait
18 until after all the curbs streets are dug up and
19 repaired.

20 All tree boxes along beach Road are
21 being weeded and cleaned out. DPW working hard
22 along with the Masone Beach crew to keep the
23 beach in pristine condition. The street sweeper
24 is out two times a week and scrap metal will be
25 dropped off by the garage and DPW will load it,

2 cut up the big pieces and the container will be
3 taken away.

4 The Long Beach Road, I talked with
5 Councilman Anthony D'Esposito. The bus stop by
6 the parking, lot somehow the litter basket was
7 destroyed and taken away and litter all over.
8 They will replace the litter basket and clean it
9 up from South Shore Collision all the way down
10 to the garage.

11 Those orange barrels out there are
12 Nassau County's. They're supposed to be over a
13 broken drain. I will check that. Otherwise
14 they will be taken way. That is my report.

15 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Zoning report.
16 No parking permit, seventy-seven issued.
17 Expired meter, seventy-three. Out of stall,
18 twenty-three. Backed into stall, twenty-seven.
19 Blocking crosswalk, we have one. Fire hydrant,
20 four. No commercial parking, thirteen.
21 Restricted parking, sixty-three. Right to curb,
22 one. Blocking driveway, three. Parked on
23 sidewalk, four. Alternate parking fifty-two.
24 Parked in a bus stop, eighteen. Left to curb,
25 three. Unlicensed landscaper, three. More than

2 twelve inches from the curb, three. In travel
3 portion of the road, four. Expired inspections,
4 thirty-nine. Expired registration, eleven.
5 Improper plates, two. No front plates,
6 thirteen. Hours of collection, garbage or bulk

8 violations, fifteen, for a total of four hundred
9 ninety-four. Respectfully submitted.

9 There were no hearings scheduled for
10 the June Board of Appeals. That is my report.

11 MAYOR McGINTY: Tuesday, July 26th
12 seven p.m. at the library our new councilman
13 from the Town of Hempstead, Anthony D'Esposito,
14 will be there to answer questions and provide us
15 with news of the township.

16 Before I go any further, Lucy Volpe
17 just walked in late. About the beach. Now we
18 have Hope Ragan with us. She is doing a
19 marvelous job at the beach as beach manager.

20 MS. RAGAN: I'm trying.

21 MAYOR McGINTY: When we got the
22 opportunity to have Barbara Volpe-Ried on the
23 Board, I thought something would happen. I have
24 to say Lucy works as hard on the beach as ever.

25 MS. RAGAN: You should make her

3 time.

4 MAYOR MCGINTY: You think I have a
5 problem with that? You wouldn't want me to.
6 So, I personally and professionally I'm very
7 pleased. By the way, you are no slouch either.
8 The beach once again is enjoying record sales of
9 our beach tags. Parking permits have gone
10 through the roof. Our gazebo you have to fight
11 to get to rent a gazebo. As a matter of fact,
12 tomorrow one of our young men in the Village,
13 Chief Madden's son is having a pre-wedding party
14 in the gazebo. He rented it as soon as he
15 could. My son is going to be there, so you
16 understand my concern.

17 MS. RAGAN: Absolutely. There are
18 enough chairs that she sits on that you can take
19 and watch. You're not far.

20 MAYOR MCGINTY: She has done a
21 marvelous job with the containment area up at
22 DPW, so much so that the DEC has called it a
23 model. We are going to continue using the
24 containment area in a twofold way. We're going
25 to continue cleaning drain boxes and lateral

2 lines until we have cleaned everything. We are
3 going to also replace the fuel tanks, the garage
4 fuel tanks. So we are going to need the
5 containment area for that as well. And we will
6 do that in conjunction with as much physical
7 participation as the DEC is willing to give us.

8 terms of the fuel tanks, that is
9 going to include a generator independent of the
10 electric. We are trying to take steps to
11 protect our residents going forward. That is
12 just a small way of doing it. An additional
13 generator at the garage. In terms of the hazard
14 mitigation program, the HMGP project, I think you
15 will all gotten letters requesting elevation
16 certificates. It's just another formality, but
17 it's well worth the effort to prove to FEMA and
18 Homeland Security that in fact the HMGP program
19 is the thing to do.

20 We are trying, just as we did with the
21 containment area and so forth, we are trying to
22 provide a model going forward. Not only do we
23 answer all the questions and dot all the I's and
24 all the rest of that, but we provide over and
25 above in our record keeping.

2 Also I think some of you have received
3 phone calls from our staff. If you haven't, you
4 will. It has to do with Sandy and New York
5 Rising case numbers. We have about a hundred
6 sixty-five, give or take homes that we don't
7 have case numbers for. We want to be sure they
8 have a case number or they didn't avail
9 themselves of New York Rising. We are doing
10 that for reimbursement purposes. So if you
11 speak to anybody and they ask you that, that is
12 what that is all about. I'll be here a week
13 from Saturday for anybody that wants to come
14 around. But, I'm around all the time.

15 The week before was Beatlemania.
16 Beatlemania had a full plate. The beach was
17 packed. While I'm thinking about that, look
18 Hope, Tilia, we have had some wonderful
19 lifeguard crews at the beach. I think this
20 may be the best crew we've had. They have grown
21 from last year. They have matured. They have
22 already had some interesting circumstances and
23 they have risen to the task. When I go down to
24 that beach at night I know, I don't want to say
25 my kishkas out, it's not appropriate, but I get

2 worried because if everybody is watching a movie
3 or a band, some kid may wander over to the
4 water. Every time I look the lifeguards are
5 walking over to the shore on their own. I think
6 sometimes they're on the payroll and sometimes
7 they're not. I don't know what it is. Truly
8 its an honor to serve with them. I'm very proud
9 of this group.

10 By the way, Barbara, I keep a beach
11 tag in my car, I keep a beach tag in my pocket.
12 I must say that things are going very well, I'm
13 pleased to see. Our DPW staff, I'm fond of
14 saying I caught ya. I haven't caught them doing
15 nothing. All I do is catch them working, it's
16 marvelous. I don't know if they know how
17 productive they are. You guys should be proud
18 of the staff around here.

19 MS. KRUIBURG: It's only since you
20 came in Mr. Mayor; I'm telling you that.

21 MAYOR MCGINTY: Tilia let me go on.
22 So ends my report. Madam clerk will you do the
23 agenda.

10 rings, and I realize it's from the Village and I
11 answer it. It turns out we have a problem on
12 Blackstone Walk. I got there. Trustee Paccione
13 met me there, as did John Sporaccio, Code
14 Enforcement and Sergeant, you were good enough
15 to be there with us. You guys at the 4th
16 Precinct are top shelf. I'm looking at the
17 officer in the back; you're smiling. You stuck
18 around while we waited to have the building
19 boarded up. I thought you went above and beyond
20 and I thank you on behalf of the Village
21 selfishly on behalf of myself. Anybody that has
22 anything for the officers?

23 MR. DiMATTEO: Was there a woman that
24 fell off her bike and she was run over on Long
25 Beach Road and you haven't found her yet?

3 morning.

4 THE SERGEANT: I don't have a report
5 on that. It has come to my mind now that there
6 was an incident. It's probably an active
7 investigation at this point with the Detective
8 Division. I don't have anything further.

9 MR. ROTHMAN: I was going to -- Jan
10 Rothman -- Mr. Mayor or anybody, is that within
11 the Village limits?

12 MAYOR MCGINTY: Yes.

13 MR. ROTHMAN: When you come out of
14 Pops.

15 MAYOR MCGINTY: It is.

16 MR. ROTHMAN: That is so dangerous
17 over there with people coming out of the bar.

18 THE SERGEANT: It's Railroad Place and
19 Long Beach Road. Was it a speeding vehicle?

20 MR. ROTHMAN: They don't know. It was
21 a hit and run. It's dangerous. Let's say
22 you're coming out of Railroad Place and you want
23 to go north towards Oceanside, you have to cross
24 three lanes and then you have to get to the
25 other side of the road and merge in. People

3 drinks and their driving habits may have been
4 affected.

5 THE SERGEANT: Are there any signs
6 there?

7 MRS. ROTHMAN: They don't want to pay
8 the parking at valet parking so they park at the
9 shopping center so they walk across six lanes of
10 moving traffic.

11 THE SERGEANT: I'll let the guys know
12 and monitor the area. Any type of VTL vehicle
13 and traffic violations.

14 MR. ROTHMAN: As everybody knows, I
15 always complain about the parking. People
16 double park constantly in front of the Island
17 Park food center, the bodega, whatever you want
18 to call it. I did notice it seemed to get a
19 little better in the last couple of weeks. I
20 don't know if it's due to increased enforcement
21 or whatever.

22 There is usually, unfortunately that
23 place has no place to park and they have a lot
24 of customers. People double park and run in.
25 It's a very dangerous intersection. You are so

2 close to Warwick. They insist on double
3 parking, running in and picking up whatever they
4 pick up. It's gotten better in the last month
5 or so. I travel that road frequently. I've
6 mentioned it before at other meetings.

7 MS. RAGAN: Hope Ragan. The stop
8 sign, the residents going into Harbor Isle
9 consistently blow through that stop sign, the
10 one at Warwick and Suffolk. I would say eight
11 out of ten cars don't stop at that stop sign.

12 MRS. ROTHMAN: It's every stop sign on
13 Warwick. I'm not arguing with you, but I take
14 that road every morning. They don't stop at
15 Suffolk, they don't stop at Radcliffe. All
16 three stop signs they go through. It's in all
17 four directions.

18 MAYOR McGINTY: If there is nothing
19 else for the police. Thank you.

20 (The sergeant left the meeting at this
21 time.)

22 MAYOR McGINTY: Madam Clerk, would you
23 continue?
