8	Any person who violates a provision of
9	this local law shall be guilty of a violation
10	punishable by a fine not exceeding five thousand
11	dollars, or imprisonment not to exceed six
12	months, or both, for a conviction of a first
13	offense. For conviction of a second offense,
14	seventy-five hundred, again, imprisonment not to
15	exceed six months, or both. For conviction of a
16	third offense, ten thousand or imprisonment for
17	a period not to exceed six months, or both.
18	The purpose of this law is to protect
19	our storm water basins, hence the Village, hence
20	the bay.
