

ORDINANCE NO. 34

RULES OF THE ROAD

Section 1

Whenever any persons traveling with any wagons, motor vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles, other vehicles, or riding horses or other animals shall meet on any street in the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, the persons so meeting shall reasonably turn their wagons, motor vehicles, horse or other animals to the right of the center of the road, so as to permit such wagons, motor vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles, other vehicles, horses or other animals to pass without interference or interruption.

Section 2

Any wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, other vehicle, horses or other animal overtaking another in any of the streets of the village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, shall pass on the left side of the overtaken wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, other vehicle, horses or other animals.

When requested to do so, the driver or person having charge of any wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, other vehicle, horse or other animal traveling in any of said streets shall, as soon as practicable, turn to the right so as to allow any overtaking wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, other vehicle, horses or other animal free passage to his left.

Section 3

All vehicles moving slowly in any of the streets of the village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, shall keep as close as possible to the curb line on the right so as to allow faster moving vehicles free passage on the left.

Section 4

In turning corners to the right in the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, wagons, motor vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles, other vehicles, horses or other

animals shall keep to the right of the center of the road.

Section 5

In turning corners to the left in the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, wagons, motor vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles, other vehicles, horses or other animals shall pass to the right of the center of the intersection of the two streets.

Section 6

The driver or persons having charge of any wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, other vehicle, horse or other animal before turning the corner of any street in said Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, or turning out, or starting from or stopping at the curb line of any street, shall first see that there is sufficient space free from other vehicles, so that such turning, stopping or starting, may be safely made, and shall then give a plainly visible or audible signal.

Section 7

No wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, other vehicle, horse or other animal, except to allow another vehicle or pedestrian to cross its path, shall stop in any public street within the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, except near the right hand curb thereof, and so as not to obstruct a crossing or street intersection.

Section 8

A wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, other vehicle, horse or other animal crossing from one side of the street to the other, in the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, shall do so by turning to the left, so as to head in the same direction as the traffic on that side of the street.

Section 9

No wagon, motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle or other vehicle, shall stop with its left side to the curb upon any street in the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York.

Section 10

In no case shall a wagon, motor vehicle or other vehicle remain backed up to the curb or be placed cross wise of any street within the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, except while actually loading or unloading, and in such case, if a horse or horses shall be hitched to any vehicle, such horse or horses shall be so placed as to head in the proper traffic direction; but, in no case, excepting on Long Beach Boulevard shall it be lawful for any person to permit such wagon, motor vehicle or other vehicle to remain backed up to the curb or so crosswise of any street for a longer period than may be actually necessary for loading or unloading.

Section 11.

No wagon, motor vehicle, or other vehicle shall stop for the taking on or letting off a passenger or loading or unloading freight, or for any other purpose, in the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, in such a way as to obstruct any street or crossing except in case of accident or other emergency or when directed to stop by a policeman or traffic officer.

Section 12.

No wagon, motor vehicle, or other vehicle within the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, shall back in order to make a turn in any street, if by so doing it interferes with other vehicles.

Section 13.

All wagons, motor vehicles, motorcycles, bicycle, other vehicles, horses or other animals shall slow down at street crossings and street intersection within the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, to a rate of speed which is safe and prudent under the conditions then obtaining.

Section 14.

No person shall drive or permit to be driven any motor vehicle or other vehicle within the Village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, in such condition, so instructed or so loaded, as to be likely to cause a delay in the traffic, or accident or injury

to man, beast or property, or to overload such vehicle so as to allow the contents to fall on any of the streets within said Village.

Section 15

No person driving any motor vehicle, other vehicle, horse, or other animal, or riding upon any motorcycle, or bicycle within the village of Island Park, Nassau County, New York, shall disobey any direction or signal given to him by any policeman, traffic policeman or traffic officer appointed by the Board of Trustees of said village in reference to stopping or starting the vehicle or animal which he is driving or on which he is riding, or in reference to the rate of speed at which said vehicle or animal is proceeding, or in reference to the course to be followed by such vehicles or animals upon such streets, or any other direction or signal given by such policeman, traffic policeman or traffic officer with reference to the conduct of traffic upon any of the streets of said Village.

Section 16

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be liable for and forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding twenty five (\$25) dollars for the first offense, and not less than twenty five (\$25) dollars or more than one hundred (\$100) dollars for the second offense, and, in addition thereto, each of said violations shall constitute and is hereby declared to be disorderly conduct, and any person violating the same shall be, and is hereby declared a disorderly person.
