ORDINANCE NO. 35

ONE WAY STREETS

Section 1

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Island Park, may from time to time, designate by resolution, which may be adopted at any meeting of the said Board of Trustees, streets in which vehicles of any description shall pass in one direction only, and shall cause the direction in which such vehicles may proceed on any of such streets or parts of streets to be conspicuously marked with signs or signals as to indicate the rules and regulations in regard thereto, and the directions in which all vehicles shall so travel, and may be resolution designate streets or parts of streets upon which there shall be no parking of vehicles or designate the hours of parking of vehicles and shall conspicuously mark with signs or signals to indicate the rules and regulations in regards to such parking or prohibition of parking (Amended June 25, 1953).

(a) The Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Island Park hereby designates the following streets in said village as streets in which vehicles shall pass in one direction only:

Kildare Road going North
Lorraine Road going South
Marina Road going North
Newport Road going South
Ostend Road going North
Parma Road going South
Hastings Road going East
Kent Road going West
Truxton Road going East

No parking on the South Side of Julian Place, between Quebec Road and Suffolk Road; no parking either side of Quebec Road between Arlington Walk and Cambridge Walk; and that the Department of Public Works obtain and install "one way" signs at each end of one way streets, and "no parking" signs on the no parking streets. (Amended June 1, 1953)

Parking is to be restricted to four (4) hours on Sagamore Road, between Quebec Road and Parma Road, and the Department of Public Works be authorized to install the necessary signs. (Amended January 18, 1954)

Section 2

It shall be the duty of all drivers of motor vehicles, wagons or other vehicles, to proceed in such streets and highways designated by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Island Park, as one way streets, as the signs and conspicuously displayed regulations on such streets shall direct.
