| 5  | MAYOR MCGINTY: On the housekeeping     |
| 6  | side of things before we get started,  |
| 7  | last Friday night my wife Jean and I   |
| 8  | were out and I failed to thank her for |
| 9  | all that she's done. Truthfully, I own |
| 10 | her a debt of thanks. I could not do   |
| 11 | this job. This full tilt I am at       |
| 12 | this job full tilt boogie to use an    |
| 13 | office expression. I couldn't do it is |
| 14 | Jean wasn't supportive, so I wanted to |
| 15 | thank her in public.                   |
| 16 | Secondly, I am blessed with a Board    |
| 17 | of Trustees. Through the history and,  |
| 18 | Mayor, I think it's safe to say I have |
| 19 | known every board since I was a boy,   |
| 20 | right? Every board of trustees since 1 |
| 21 | was a boy?                             |
| 22 | UNKNOWN: Probably.                     |
| 23 | MAYOR MCGINTY: They include some       |
| 24 | service my father did with the board.  |
| 25 | We are blessed, we as a village are    |

| 4  | Board of Trustees throughout this       |
| 5  | county. We have two of our committed    |
| 6  | people with us tonight, a former fire   |
| 7  | chief, a former commissioner, battalion |
| 8  | commissioner, county commissioner       |
| 9  | you are still in the middle of that     |
| 10 | and of course our on Trustee Volpe-Ried |
| 11 | who has taught so many of the young     |
| 12 | people here in this village and in this |
| 13 | school district, so give them a hand    |
| 14 | they deserve.                           |
| 15 | UNKNOWN: How about Connie?              |
| 16 | MAYOR MCGINTY: I always thank           |
| 17 | Madam Clerk for her efforts. I don't    |
| 18 | know if I said this before you came in  |
| 19 | or not, but one of the things I said to |
| 20 | her is if I misspeak she will stop me   |
| 21 | and she will.                           |
| 22 | I'm going to start in the middle        |
| 23 | and then kind of work around it. Right  |
| 24 | now, we're in the design and            |
| 25 | engineering phase of the HMPG project,  |

| 2  | the Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program  |
| 3  | In mid May we're going to accept the    |
| 4  | results of our quest for requests for   |
| 5  | proposals. Under New York state law,    |
| 6  | we're doing this project and we have    |
| 7  | got to seek bids, and those bids we     |
| 8  | will choose the most responsible and    |
| 9  | the most financially efficacious bid    |
| 10 | when they come in and that's the middle |
| 11 | of this project.                        |
| 12 | Once we get the design and              |
| 13 | engineering done and we believe         |
| 14 | Madam Clerk, seriously are we when      |
| 15 | talk about design and engineering       |
| 16 | phase, I think we are talking about a   |
| 17 | six month period; right? Is that        |
| 18 | you understand?                         |
| 19 | MS. CONROY: That's correct.             |
| 20 | MAYOR MCGINTY: That's what we           |
| 21 | understand and we understand that we    |
| 22 | did that RFP ourselves and in doing so  |
| 23 | we saved anywhere from, you know, pick  |
| 24 | a number 75- to \$100,000 by doing it   |
| 25 | in-house and we did this request for    |

| 2          | proposal in-house. It's a 30 page       |
| 3          | document. It's not one page. It's a     |
| 4          | 30 page document and we did it under    |
| 5          | the assistance of Deputy Commissioner   |
| 6          | Sean Sallie, S-A-L-L-I-E, from Nassau   |
| 7          | County's Public Works and direct        |
| 8          | supervision of Homeland Security and    |
| 9          | FEMA. So every step of the way not      |
| 10         | only have we saved money, which will    |
| 11         | plow back into the project, but we have |
| 12         | had advice and consent from the         |
| 13         | checkbook people. So that's the first   |
| 14         | part to get.                            |
| 15         | To get to the design and                |
| 16         | engineering phase we first had to be    |
| 17         | approved for the investigatory process  |
| 18         | and that investigatory process involved |
| 19         | the cleaning of 17 percent of the drain |
| 20         | lines within the Village of Island      |
| 21         | Park, as well as a number drain boxes.  |
| 22         | Well, we took it a little further. We   |
| 23         | cleaned and videotaped every drain,     |
| 24         | every lateral drain, within the         |
| 25         | confines of the Village of Island Park  |

| 2  | and all 326 drain boxes and we did that |
| 3  | under the direct we sought and got      |
| 4  | the direct supervision of the           |
| 5  | Department of Environmental             |
| 6  | Conservation, the New York State DEC.   |
| 7  | And that involved, some of you remember |
| 8  | this, we built a containment area at    |
| 9  | the far end, at the north end of the    |
| 10 | village behind the public works garage  |
| 11 | and we did that in such a way that we   |
| 12 | had a tertiary filtering system, which  |
| 13 | produced water at the end of the day    |
| 14 | which was clean enough to go back into  |
| 15 | the bay, and not only was it the        |
| 16 | environmental and ecological thing to   |
| 17 | do but it also cut our costs for        |
| 18 | rubbish removal and so forth.           |
| 19 | So at the end of the first phase we     |
| 20 | were under the budget by 1 million      |
| 21 | 140-some-odd-thousand dollars, which we |
| 22 | got rolled into the second phase and    |
| 23 | that was through the good offices of    |
| 24 | Congresswoman Rice and Senator          |
| 25 | Schuman's office. Their staff is top    |

| 2  | notch. They helped us go a long way.    |
| 3  | Now, we have got all our drains         |
| 4  | mapped. Maybe there was mapping before  |
| 5  | the watershed of this storm, no pun     |
| 6  | intended, but we didn't have maps so we |
| 7  | had to redo them, okay. So now we are   |
| 8  | into the design and engineering phase.  |
| 9  | In addition, we are going to be         |
| 10 | replacing tidal flex valves along the   |
| 11 | canals and, by the way, the dead end    |
| 12 | streets up by Redfield, yeah, Redfield  |
| 13 | I believe is the one. We will be        |
| 14 | replacing those tidal flex valves with  |
| 15 | larger valves and along the lines       |
| 16 | it's not enough to replace check valves |
| 17 | or install new drains. We have to have  |
| 18 | the wherewithal to maintain them        |
| 19 | properly, and along those lines         |
| 20 | Congresswoman Rice's office is working  |
| 21 | with us in conjunction with the EPA,    |
| 22 | the Environmental Protection Agency,    |
| 23 | clean water funds so that over time we  |
| 24 | can maintain and keep our drains clean. |
| 25 | In addition, we completed a grant       |

| 2  | process, again, in-house. We have been  |
| 3  | doing our grants in-house, which by the |
| 4  | way is difficult, time consuming, but   |
| 5  | it saves a great deal of money. I       |
| 6  | believe the last time we had a grant    |
| 7  | officer in the village, if memory       |
| 8  | serves me, it ran an estimated \$50,000 |
| 9  | a year. Sometimes it was reimbursed     |
| 10 | from the grant, sometimes not. Pretty   |
| 11 | much?                                   |
| 12 | UNKNOWN: Pretty much.                   |
| 13 | MAYOR MCGINTY: Thank you, Mayor.        |
| 14 | So we have got this grant now in        |
| 15 | conjunction with the Town of Hempstead, |
| 16 | and what that grant entails is the      |
| 17 | purchase of a guzzler truck. That's an  |
| 18 | industrial size truck to clean drains.  |
| 19 | MR. DEMATTEO: Mr. Mayor, I saw          |
| 20 | that truck. The village owns that       |
| 21 | truck?                                  |
| 22 | MAYOR MCGINTY: No, no. Hold your        |
| 23 | question for a moment. I will address   |
| 24 | it in a different way.                  |
| 25 | The guzzler truck, you saw that         |

| 2  | guzzler truck when Mainline? Who?       |
| 3  | MS. CONROY: Parkline.                   |
| 4  | MAYOR MCGINTY: Parkline. I do           |
| 5  | that all of the time. Parkline did the  |
| 6  | drain cleaning and that truck you saw   |
| 7  | is a I am sure there is a technical     |
| 8  | name but everybody in the business      |
| 9  | calls it a guzzler.                     |
| 10 | What you saw we have two smaller        |
| 11 | vacuum trucks. The one vacuum truck,    |
| 12 | the smaller one also provides clean     |
| 13 | street sweeping. We don't use that so   |
| 14 | much for drains. We use the bigger one  |
| 15 | for draining boxes.                     |
| 16 | MR. DEMATTEO: So the village is         |
| 17 | going to do that? They are going to     |
| 18 | drain all those things?                 |
| 19 | MAYOR MCGINTY: Yes. So we will          |
| 20 | recreate a containment area, albeit     |
| 21 | smaller, at the north end behind the    |
| 22 | public works garage, and I have already |
| 23 | asked the commissioner, Ms. Carrie      |
| 24 | Meeks-Gallagher, for direct             |
| 25 | supervision. It's too important to be   |

| 2  | left to our own druthers. I would       |
| 3  | rather have professional environmental  |
| 4  | engineers making sure that we are doing |
| 5  | it exactly according to the way it's    |
| 6  | exactly correct environmentally and     |
| 7  | ecologically. It's so very important    |
| 8  | to the future. So while we are at       |
| 9  | that so that's what we're doing with    |
| 10 | the tidal flex valves with lateral      |
| 11 | drains.                                 |
| 12 | Now, those lateral drains take for      |
| 13 | example my favorite block of all time   |
| 14 | Deal Road. Right now there is a         |
| 15 | lateral drain, a 6-inch lateral drain.  |
| 16 | It holds 34 cubic feet of water per     |
| 17 | hundred linear feet. New drain pipe     |
| 18 | whether it be 15 or 18 inches will hold |
| 19 | 189 cubic feet of water. So these       |
| 20 | drain pipes, these lateral drain pipes, |
| 21 | storm drains, are going to be double    |
| 22 | duty. Not only are they going to take   |
| 23 | the water out but at high tide they     |
| 24 | will hold the water back a little bit,  |
| 25 | you know? Again, very, very important.  |

| 2  | So in the reality when we get to        |
| 3  | construction certainly the Hegarty      |
| 4  | environment will be the first part.     |
| 5  | The Hegarty neighborhood will be the    |
| 6  | first part and we will go north down    |
| 7  | Suffolk Road from Warwick Road down to  |
| 8  | Island Parkway. But now here is the     |
| 9  | thing, we were all walking down Suffolk |
| 10 | Road and we were with some of the       |
| 11 | elected officials, whether it be        |
| 12 | Senator Kaminsky, Assemblywoman Miller, |
| 13 | Councilman D'Esposito and Commissioner  |
| 14 | Parrino. Commissioner Parrino is a      |
| 15 | bear of a man, six-six, six-five, big   |
| 16 | boy. I asked if we could what would     |
| 17 | happen, well, why don't you let us      |
| 18 | start trenching Suffolk Road, taking    |
| 19 | out the old and putting in the          |
| 20 | replacement drains. He said, "Oh, of    |
| 21 | course you can do that, however, the    |
| 22 | minute you put a backhoe into the       |
| 23 | ground, the 40 million goes out of the  |
| 24 | window." We are not allowed we can      |
| 25 | do pothole restoration and we are about |

| 2  | to bring Stasi in to do some work       |
| 3  | around some of our drain boxes and      |
| 4  | manholes, but we are not permitted to   |
| 5  | start construction work until we have   |
| 6  | approval. That approval will come from  |
| 7  | after the design and engineering phase  |
| 8  | when we move into the construction      |
| 9  | phase and we award a contract.          |
| 10 | MS. CANNON: How long can that be?       |
| 11 | MAYOR MCGINTY: Well, we believe         |
| 12 | design and engineering we believe that  |
| 13 | to be a six month process and it's mid  |
| 14 | May the responses to requests for       |
| 15 | proposals are due. We will accelerate   |
| 16 | our decision and we will move forward   |
| 17 | on the construction side in terms of    |
| 18 | the RFP for construction and the actual |
| 19 | work. As a matter of fact, we are       |
| 20 | working on the RFP for construction     |
| 21 | now. Granted we don't have the design   |
| 22 | in place but you can do some of the     |
| 23 | generics and we have been seeking       |
| 24 | advice from Nassau County DPW and       |
| 25 | seeking advice from Homeland Security   |

| 2  | and the Governor's Office for Storm    |
| 3  | Recovery all of whom have been         |
| 4  | incredibly cooperative. That's where   |
| 5  | we are there.                          |
| 6  | At the far end of the village we       |
| 7  | have constructed a fireman training    |
| 8  | center and that, frankly, that goes    |
| 9  | hand in glove with everything we are   |
| 10 | doing. As we speak, there are 177      |
| 11 | homes that are up, raised, to base     |
| 12 | flood elevation plus two or three with |
| 13 | monolithic foundations. Well, it take  |
| 14 | a different kind of training to handle |
| 15 | that situation. First of all, I am     |
| 16 | told that you have got to understand   |
| 17 | what happens to concrete when it gets  |
| 18 | very, very hot. It exudes dangerous    |
| 19 | gases, Chief Gagliardi, and they are   |
| 20 | the construction being used. Instead   |
| 21 | of plywood they are using a lot of     |
| 22 | approved, industry-approved,           |
| 23 | pressboard, trust construction for     |
| 24 | floors, for roofs and any combination  |
| 25 | therein and as a result the fire       |

| 2  | department gets a set of plans or gets  |
| 3  | notification. 10 Parma Road, okay,      |
| 4  | we're doing trust construction and in   |
| 5  | the floors and ceilings. Well, the      |
| 6  | fire department knows that, so as to    |
| 7  | protect the men and facilitate the      |
| 8  | proper approach to firefighting.        |
| 9  | We also while I am up at the far        |
| 10 | end we also took out the old fuel       |
| 11 | tanks and as a village we were very     |
| 12 | lucky. Those fuel tanks were well       |
| 13 | beyond their useful age, their useful   |
| 14 | life, usefulness. No damage to the      |
| 15 | soil, the soil was clean and we're      |
| 16 | about ready to put in to two new fuel   |
| 17 | tanks. They have been ordered, fuel     |
| 18 | tanks and something else. They will     |
| 19 | order them very specific.               |
| 20 | At this time the Town of Hempstead      |
| 21 | has permitted us to make use of their   |
| 22 | fuel depots, so we're still paying      |
| 23 | government rate, wholesale rate, on our |
| 24 | fuel costs, which is a great savings to |
| 25 | us.                                     |

| 2  | As you come down into Island Park,      |
| 3  | you will notice that we have been done  |
| 4  | a great deal of work for curb appeal    |
| 5  | and that curb appeal ties into our      |
| 6  | drainage project. We have some money    |
| 7  | through the New York State Dormitory    |
| 8  | Authority, which will ultimately        |
| 9  | provide part of transit-oriented        |
| 10 | development along Long Beach Road.      |
| 11 | It's an upgrading of the road and it's  |
| 12 | traffic mitigation. We will be having   |
| 13 | what is known as bump-outs. We will     |
| 14 | have some diagonal parking. We will     |
| 15 | have crosswalks with solar signs        |
| 16 | informing people that there could be a  |
| 17 | pedestrian in the crosswalk. Between    |
| 18 | the parallel the diagonal parking       |
| 19 | and the bump-outs it will have a        |
| 20 | tendency to slow traffic down, which is |
| 21 | a vital importance to us.               |
| 22 | Along the curbing you are going to      |
| 23 | have environmentally friendly swales    |
| 24 | which is, for lack of a better word,    |
| 25 | it's vegetation. It's decorative        |

| 2  | vegetation that drains water faster and |
| 3  | more effectively than the grass in our  |
| 4  | front yards. It should be helpful to    |
| 5  | all of us.                              |
| 6  | As you come down Long Beach Road,       |
| 7  | we're south on Long Beach Road now      |
| 8  | standing outside Olympia's Diner, the   |
| 9  | Island Park diner, and if you look to   |
| 10 | the south you will see a drain box in   |
| 11 | the middle of Long Beach Road. We       |
| 12 | found that drain box by accident. We    |
| 13 | had the guzzler out, the vacuum truck   |
| 14 | out, and we found this drain box 21 and |
| 15 | a half inches under concrete and        |
| 16 | mechanical. Now, you would say, well,   |
| 17 | did you get permission from the county? |
| 18 | No. We figured we would apologize       |
| 19 | later. We rebuilt that drain and in     |
| 20 | doing so it has mitigated the inherent  |
| 21 | flooding between the tracks on the      |
| 22 | south and Warwick Road on the north     |
| 23 | along Long Beach Road, and to further   |
| 24 | protect our storefronts we have when    |
| 25 | there is a combination of a nor'easter  |

| 2  | and a high tide, we close off that      |
| 3  | block because none of us want to see    |
| 4  | water going into the stores.            |
| 5  | MS. HASSETT: When was that              |
| 6  | mitigated?                              |
| 7  | MAYOR MCGINTY: Say it again?            |
| 8  | MS. HASSETT: When was that              |
| 9  | mitigated?                              |
| 10 | MAYOR MCGINTY: The drain was built      |
| 11 | up sometime in the last 15 months but,  |
| 12 | Ms. Hassett, it is not perfect. It's    |
| 13 | better than it was. We did clean the    |
| 14 | drain as far as we could. There is a    |
| 15 | drain that runs from that there is a    |
| 16 | drain pipe, a lateral drain pipe, that  |
| 17 | runs from that drain box out to         |
| 18 | California Place South, out to the      |
| 19 | canal bordering south and north,        |
| 20 | California Place North and South.       |
| 21 | There is a second lateral pipe due to   |
| 22 | be installed under the county slash     |
| 23 | town slash Homeland Security project    |
| 24 | and it will end up with two flex valves |
| 25 | in the canal.                           |

| 3  | at the last meeting.                    |
| 4  | MAYOR MCGINTY: Okay. And when           |
| 5  | that portion of the job is done, we     |
| 6  | will redo well, I think they are        |
| 7  | going to well, the streets are going    |
| 8  | to be redone between Austin Boulevard   |
| 9  | and the train tracks.                   |
| 10 | MR. DEMATTEO: Is that where the         |
| 11 | car wash is? Is the pipe going to go    |
| 12 | all of the way through from Island Park |
| 13 | down that whole thing?                  |
| 14 | MAYOR MCGINTY: One pipe already         |
| 15 | does.                                   |
| 16 | MR. DEMATTEO: Okay.                     |
| 17 | MAYOR MCGINTY: A second a               |
| 18 | sister pipe, if you will, a tandem pipe |
| 19 | will go down as well.                   |
| 20 | MR. DEMATTEO: Okay.                     |
| 21 | MAYOR MCGINTY: So those streets         |
| 22 | will be reconfigured and you will get   |
| 23 | environmentally friendly swales going   |
| 24 | along the tracks and along the parking  |
| 25 | lot to better handle drainage going     |

| 3  | As we continue with our discussion,     |
| 4  | let me stop here. Does anybody have     |
| 5  | any questions so far?                   |
| 6  | Name and address for the record         |
| 7  | please.                                 |
| 8  | MS. HASSETT: Laura Hassett, 8           |
| 9  | Norfolk Road, Island Park. To go back   |
| 10 | to the guzzler truck, how often will we |
| 11 | have access to the guzzler truck?       |
| 12 | MAYOR MCGINTY: It's under               |
| 13 | discussion but we are assured that we   |
| 14 | will have it enough. We will be able    |
| 15 | to we will have sufficient use of       |
| 16 | it.                                     |
| 17 | MS. HASSETT: In your discussions        |
| 18 | do you see it as something that we      |
| 19 | would do as an annual cleaning or after |
| 20 | several high moon tides that we may     |
| 21 | need to clean out?                      |
| 22 | MAYOR MCGINTY: It will be a             |
| 23 | periodic cleaning, and when I say       |
| 24 | periodic right now as a anecdotally,    |
| 25 | right now Nassau County sends a vacuum  |

| 3  | weeks to vacuum out the sanitary sewer  |
| 4  | system, specifically the manhole        |
| 5  | covers. Now there are times when it     |
| 6  | doesn't come down here for eight weeks  |
| 7  | and there is times it's down here every |
| 8  | month. Upon investigation we will       |
| 9  | determine how often.                    |
| 10 | MS. HASSETT: But naturally they         |
| 11 | are not doing every section every I     |
| 12 | mean, they pick different areas to      |
| 13 | MAYOR MCGINTY: We pick.                 |
| 14 | MS. HASSETT: Or you pick.               |
| 15 | MAYOR MCGINTY: Well, not me. The        |
| 16 | village does, yes.                      |
| 17 | MS. HASSETT: Okay. When you said        |
| 18 | that the new drains would hold 189      |
| 19 | gallons of water                        |
| 20 | MAYOR MCGINTY: I used that now,         |
| 21 | wait. I was speaking specifically of    |
| 22 | Deal Road and the change in pipe        |
| 23 | diameter from the present 6-inch to a   |
| 24 | possible 15 to 18-inch drain and I was  |
| 25 | making an example Fyery no stroot       |

| 3  | going to happen on every street but    |
| 4  | all                                    |
| 5  | MS. HASSETT: So Deal Road will go      |
| 6  | from approximately 64? Is that what    |
| 7  | you said that it is right now? It      |
| 8  | holds approximately                    |
| 9  | MAYOR MCGINTY: No, what I said was     |
| 10 | 34 cubic feet of water per 100 linear  |
| 11 | feet and it would go to approximately  |
| 12 | 189 cubic feet of water per 100 linear |
| 13 | feet of pipe.                          |
| 14 | MS. HASSETT: Okay, so you are the      |
| 15 | math professor, so what does that come |
| 16 | out to? What is the difference from    |
| 17 | what it how the                        |
| 18 | MAYOR MCGINTY: Thirty-four to 189?     |
| 19 | Substantially. You won't have severe   |
| 20 | flooding on Deal Road.                 |
| 21 | MS. HASSETT: So are there spots        |
| 22 | besides Deal Road where you see that   |
| 23 | going in?                              |
| 24 | MAYOR MCGINTY: Oh, yes. We are         |
| 25 | going to change all of the drains on   |

| 2  | Suffolk Road, which there are inherent |
| 3  | problems to replacing the drains and   |
| 4  | we're moving forward with it. We have  |
| 5  | bog and underground stream             |
| 6  | considerations and there is an         |
| 7  | engineering concept where picture the  |
| 8  | top of a pipe, the arc on the top of a |
| 9  | pipe. Well, at the apex of that pipe   |
| 10 | you have got to have a certain amount  |
| 11 | of distance between the apex of the    |
| 12 | pipe and the street. That will         |
| 13 | determine how large those pipes will   |
| 14 | be.                                    |
| 15 | MS. HASSETT: Okay. Then you said       |
| 16 | naturally, you are going to start with |
| 17 | the most critical parts of the village |
| 18 | to mitigate first. Hegarty School      |
| 19 | being one of those areas and then you  |
| 20 | are going South Suffolk. What about -  |
| 21 | MAYOR MCGINTY: No, North Suffolk.      |

| 8  | The Long Island Housing Partnership     |
| 9  | works with the federal government       |

| 14 | In addition to that, we have just       |
| 15 | passed in the last month or two we have |

| 20 | case presently taxes are being paid or  |
| 21 | taxes are secured and then paid off in  |

| 25 | Attorney General. They permitted us to  |
