SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

The Village of Island Park is amending Local Law 23 of 2016, 51-G Building Construction Administration, Section 51-G-5, Duties and Powers of Building Inspectors, to provide the Chief Building Inspector with a schedule of estimated costs.

SECTION 2. Addition to Section 51-G-5 Duties and Powers of Building Inspectors

H. Construction Guidelines for Determining Estimated Costs

The Chief Building inspector is authorized to fix, by regulations, a schedule of square feet and/or cubic feet for buildings or structures of varying types of construction and classes of occupancy to serve as the basis for determining estimated costs. The estimated cost of the structure shall be determined by the Chief Building Inspector.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgement shall not effect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgement or order shall be rendered.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
