Penalties:

A) Failure to comply with a violation order, within the time limit stated therein, shall constitute an offense. A person convicted of an offense shall be punished by a fine not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed fifteen (15) days, or both. Each and every week and such continued failure to comply with a violation order, after such time limit, may constitute a separate offense for which the aforesaid penalties may be cumulatively imposed. Notwithstanding the foregoing, punishment by imprisonment under this paragraph shall not exceed one (1) year regardless of the number of offenses.

- B) The penalties heretofore prescribed shall not be imposed upon a person who by operation of law acquires premises containing violations for which a violation order has been issued, for a period of one month after the date of such acquisition of the premises. Nevertheless, the penalties provided shall attach and apply, either upon the expiration date of such one month period, or upon transfer of title to the premises before the expiration of such period, whichever first occurs.
- C) The act of the Board of Trustees in assessing any levying the costs of removal against the land adjacent to such sidewalk, pursuant to Section 4 of Ordinance 11, may be in addition to and in conjunction with the penalty prescribed by Section 4 of Ordinance 11, and shall not bar or prevent further action under this Section.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
