#### **ORDINANCE NO. 102**

# <u>Section 1</u> The following areas are designated as parking meter zones:

- (a) That area located at the Island Park Railroad Station on the easterly side of the Long Island Railroad Company's Right of Way and bounded by the easterly side of Long Beach Road at Station Plaza, California Place South, California Place North, Austin Boulevard and up to and including that area 200 feet northeast of the new Railroad Sub-Station [Amended December 20, 1962].
- (b) That area located near the Island Park Railroad Station, beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the Village boundary with the southerly side of the Long Island Railroad Right of Way, then northerly along said Right of Way 275 feet plus or minus, then easterly 50 feet plus or minus, then southerly 275 feet plus or minus, then westerly to the point of beginning [Amended April 14, 1960].

## Section 2

On areas so designated, the proper officers shall cause parking spacing on the pavements or curbs, or by other appropriate measure, and in such space so marked, shall erect, or cause to be erected, a parking meter, which upon the deposit of a coin, or combination of coins of the united States, indicated on the meters, which will entitle the party parking his or her car to a limited time as indicated on the parking meter, and the time when such period has elapsed.

### Section 3

It shall be unlawful for the owner or operator of any motor or other vehicle to park between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day for more than the maximum time indicated on the dial of the parking meters [Amended December 20, 1962].

### Section 4

In order that the police officers may properly compute the time during which a vehicle is parked, the owner or operator of said vehicle shall, upon entering such parking space, during the tine of limited parking, immediately deposit a coin, or combination of

coins of the United States, in the parking meter situated at the side of said parking space; and operate same according to the instructions thereon. Failure to do so shall constitute a violation of this ordinance, upon deposit of five cent, ten cent or twenty five cent coins and placing the meter in operation, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle during the period of parking time, which has been prescribed for the particular amounts deposited. The Parking Meters, when installed and properly operated, shall be so adjusted that five cent, ten cent or twenty five cent coins may be deposited at any time throughout the maximum range of the meters; five cent coins permitting the vehicle to be parked for a period of two hours, each ten cent coin permitting the vehicle to be parked for a period of tour hours, and each twenty five cent coin ten hours. If such a vehicle shall remain parked in any such parking space for such length of time that the meter shall indicate by proper signal that the lawful parking period has expired, such vehicle shall be considered as parking overtime and the parking overtime of a vehicle shall constitute a violation of this ordinance [Amended September 30, 1959].

### Section 5

It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle across any line or marking designating a parking space, or to park said vehicle in any way that the same shall not be wholly within a parking space as designated by said lines or markings.

### Section 6

It shall be unlawful to deposit, or cause to be deposited, in any parking meter, a slug or substitute for a coin of the United States.

### Section 7

It shall be unlawful for any person to deface, tamper with, damage, open or willfully break, destroy or impair, the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the terms of this ordinance.

### Section 8 Penalties

Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed to be disorderly conduct, punishable upon conviction by a fine of not less than three (\$3.00) dollars or

more than twenty five (\$25.00) dollars for each offense. [Amended May 19, 19603].

### Section 9 Reservation of Powers

Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as prohibiting the Village of Island Park from providing for bus stops and taxi cab stands and similar matters, including the loading and unloading of trucks, vans or other commercial vehicles in said parking zones or otherwise in said Village of Island Park.

### Section 10

Repeal of Conflicting ordinances. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this ordinance shall be cumulative of other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this ordinance.

### Section 11 Severability

If any section or parts thereof, in this ordinance, shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or of any other section or provisions thereof.
